Meeting Objectives:

The purpose of the sixth Planning Team Meeting was the initiate the conversation on the Far East Mobility assets, challenges, needs and priorities.

Meeting Format

The meeting began with a round of staff introductions and a recap of the plan timeline. We then went over the meeting objectives and revisited the mobility related goals, and feedback received from previous Planning Team Meetings, Community Meetings, and community surveys. Next, our consultant Hannah Santiago from Cambridge Systematics (CS) discussed Mobility Goals, Assets and Challenges and facilitated a group discussion along with prioritizing mobility opportunities. Notes were taken throughout the meeting and are shown within the Mural Board at the end of this summary.

Mobility Challenges Discussion

Hannah Santiago presented to the team on goals related to Mobility. Major takeaways from the group discussion on mobility challenges include:

- S. Foster to Rigsby Ave. to Houston St. TxDOT construction at Loop 410 & IH-10 is a priority
- Need for turn lanes on E. Houston St. before getting to Foster Road.

- Providing more capacity to roadways and bridges especially connection points from Loop 410 to Rigsby Ave.
- Addressing increasing traffic / congestion for all types of vehicles including freight
- Cultural, historical, and natural resources include transportation hubs for people to park
- Walkability for those with disabilities needs to be addressed
- Widen bike lanes
- Increase connectivity
- Increase connectivity between different sides of Loop 410, targeting E. Houston St. connection
- Ensure bike lanes are only used by bikers; provide sidewalks for walkers to separate uses
- Address increase of trucks going down E. Houston St.
- Safe ways to get to trails and access of those trails
- Traffic when cycling on access roads, dangerous for cyclists
- Traffic congestion in area
- Traffic flow and considerations from newer developments

Prioritizing Mobility Opportunities Discussion

Major takeaways from the group discussion on prioritizing mobility opportunities include:

- Consider adding trail space at or along undeveloped lots
- Clean up areas to allow for walkability, residents get comfortable walking WW White (North & South)
- SE Community Area Plan include trails south of Lakeside as Focus Area opportunity to work closely with area plans for Rosillo Creekway
- Roadways identified for priority and further enhancements:
 - Top Gun Dr.
 - Willenbrock Ave.
 - o Bible St.
 - Pecan Valley North and South
 - o Lakewood Dr.
 - Hampton Ave.
 - Schradder Dr.
 - o Amanda Ave.
 - o Bulah St. (connecting to Salado Creek Area)
- Bike and walking trail access (enhanced)
- Connectivity to local trails
- Improve biking in area in using the access road along Loop 410
- Improve congestion along Rigsby Ave. and Bible St.

Focus Areas Updates

The project manager presented on brief updates regarding the draft Focus Areas for the Far East Community Area Plan. Planning Team members agreed with the updates made and refined Focus Areas will be presented at Planning Team Meeting #7.
